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Mayor Lightfoot Unveils Plan to Reopen Chicago

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot, alongside the Chicago Department of Public Health (CDPH), today announced the “Protecting Chicago” framework that the City will be using to guide Chicago’s reopening process amid COVID-19.

The framework – organized into five phases in alignment with the State of Illinois’ “Restore Illinois” plan – will advise Chicagoans on how to safely exit from shelter-in-place while continuing to prioritize the health of our most vulnerable residents.

“Throughout the COVID-19 crisis, we have been committed to basing our decisions on the science and data related to this disease and communicating our actions to the public in an open and transparent way,” said Mayor Lightfoot.

“Though we still have a way to go before we can begin reopening our city, when the time comes, that reopening will follow our thoughtful, data-driven process aimed at ensuring all our residents and businesses are informed and supported every step of the way.”

The framework lays out how the City is thinking about reopening, and the details for each phase are being informed by



economic and health data, and a combination of input from industry working groups, health experts and the public. As part of the reopening strategy, the City is soliciting public input to gauge sentiment on shelter-in-place and ensure the reopening is phased in a way that eases concerns that residents may have. can visit <https://www.chicago.gov/coronavirus/reopeningsurvey> to complete a short survey. The “Protecting Chicago” framework comprises five phases, and Chicago has already transitioned from phase one (Strict Stay-at-Home) to phase two (Stay-at-Home):

PHASE ONE: STRICT STAY-AT-HOME – Limit the amount of

contact with others; goal is to limit interactions to rapidly slow the spread of COVID-19

- Essential workers go to work; everyone else works from home
- Stay at home and limit going out to essential activities only
- Physically distance from anyone you do not live with, especially vulnerable friends and

family

PHASE TWO: STAY-AT-HOME – Guard against unsafe interactions with others; goal is to continue flattening the curve while safely being outside

- Essential workers go to work; everyone else works from home
- Stay at home as much as possible
- Wear a face covering

while outside your home
• Physically distance from anyone you do not live with, especially vulnerable friends and family

PHASE THREE: CAUTIOUSLY REOPEN – Strict physical distancing with some businesses opening; goal is to thoughtfully begin to

Governor Pritzker Announces Restore Illinois: A Public Health Approach to Safely Reopen the State

Building on data, science, and guidance from public health experts and after consulting with stakeholders across the state, Governor JB Pritzker announced Restore Illinois, a five-phase plan

focused on saving lives, livelihood, and safely reopening Illinois. The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) has 11 Emergency Medical Services Regions that have traditionally guided

its statewide public health work. For the purposes of Restore Illinois, from those 11, four health regions are established, each with the ability to independently move through a phased approach: Northeast

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Phase 1 – Rapid Spread:

The rate of infection among those tested and the number of patients admitted to the hospital is high or rapidly increasing. Strict stay at home and social distancing guidelines are put in place and only essential businesses remain open. Every region has experienced this phase once already and could return to it if mitigation efforts are unsuccessful.

Phase 2 – Flattening: The rate of infection among those tested and the number of patients admitted to the hospital beds and ICU beds increases at an ever slower rate, moving toward a flat and even a downward

trajectory. Non-essential retail stores reopen for curbside pickup and delivery. Illinoisans are directed to wear a face covering when outside the home, and can begin enjoying additional outdoor activities like golf, boating and fishing while practicing social distancing.

To varying degrees, every region is experiencing flattening as of early May. **Phase 3 – Recovery:** The rate of infection among those tested, the number of patients admitted to the hospital, and the number of patients needing ICU beds is stable or declining. Manufacturing, offices, retail, barbershops and salons can reopen to the public with capacity and other limits and safety

precautions. All gatherings limited to 10 or fewer people are allowed. Face coverings and social distancing are the norm.

Phase 4 – Revitalization: The rate of infection among those tested and the number of patients admitted to the hospital continues to decline. All gatherings of up to 50 people are allowed, restaurants and bars reopen, travel resumes, child care and schools reopen under guidance from the IDPH. Face coverings and social distancing are the norm.

Phase 5 – Illinois Restored: With a vaccine or highly effective treatment widely available or the elimination of any new cases over a sustained period, the economy fully reopens with safety precautions continuing. Conventions, festivals and large events are permitted, and all businesses, schools, and places of recreation can open with new safety guidance and procedures in place reflecting the lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic.

reopen Chicago safely
•Non-essential workers begin to return to work in a phased way

•Select businesses, non-profits, city entities open with demonstrated, appropriate protections for workers and customers
•When meeting others, physically distance and wear a face covering
•Non-business, social gatherings limited to <10 persons

•Phased, limited public amenities begin to open
•Stay at home if you feel ill or have come into contact with someone with COVID-19
•Continue to physically distance from vulnerable

populations
•Get tested if you have symptoms

PHASE FOUR: GRADUAL RESUME – Continued staggered reopening into a new normal; goal is to further reopen Chicago while ensuring the safety of residents
•Additional business and capacity restrictions are lifted with appropriate safeguards
•Additional public amenities open
•Continue to wear face covering and physically distance
•Continue to distance and allow vulnerable residents to shelter

•Get tested if you have symptoms or think you have had COVID-19

PHASE FIVE: PROTECT – Continue to protect vulnerable populations; goal is to continue to maintain safety until COVID-19 is contained

•All businesses open
•Non-vulnerable individuals can resume working
•Most activities resume with health safety in place
•Some events can resume
•Set up screenings and tests at work or with your family
•Sign up for a vaccine on the COVID Coach web portal

El gobernador Pritzker Anuncia Restore Illinois: Un Enfoque de Salud Pública para Reabrir el Estado de Manera Segura

Sobre la base de datos, ciencia y orientación de expertos en salud pública y después de consultar con las partes interesadas de todo el estado, el gobernador JB Pritzker anunció Restore Illinois, un plan de cinco fases enfocado en salvar vidas, medios de vida y reabrir de manera segura Illinois. El Departamento de Salud Pública de Illinois (IDPH) tiene 11 Regiones de Servicios Médicos de Emergencia que tradicionalmente han guiado su trabajo de salud pública en todo el estado. A los fines de Restaurar Illinois, a partir de esos 11, se establecen cuatro regiones de salud, cada una con la capacidad de moverse de forma independiente a través de un enfoque por fases: el noreste de Illinois; Illinois centro-norte; Centro de Illinois; y el sur de Illinois.

Fase 1 - Propagación rápida: la tasa de infección entre los examinados y el número de pacientes ingresados en el hospital es alto o está aumentando rápidamente. La estricta permanencia en el hogar y las pautas de distanciamiento social se establecen y solo las empresas esenciales permanecen abiertas. Cada región ya ha experimentado esta fase una vez y podría volver a ella si los esfuerzos de mitigación no tienen éxito.

Fase 2: aplanamiento: la tasa de infección entre los examinados y el número de pacientes ingresados en las camas de hospital y en la UCI aumenta a un ritmo cada vez más lento, avanzando hacia una trayectoria plana e incluso descendente. Las tiendas minoristas no esenciales se vuelven a abrir para la recogida y entrega en la acera. A los residentes de Illinois se les indica que se cubran la cara cuando están fuera de casa y pueden comenzar a disfrutar de actividades adicionales al aire libre como golf, paseos en bote y pesca mientras practican el distanciamiento social. En diversos grados, cada región está experimentando un aplanamiento a principios de mayo.

Fase 3 - Recuperación: la tasa de infección entre los examinados, el número de pacientes ingresados en el hospital y el número de pacientes que necesitan camas en la UCI es estable o está disminuyendo. La fabricación, las oficinas, el comercio minorista, las peluquerías y los salones pueden reabrir al público con capacidad y otros límites y precauciones de seguridad. Se permiten todas las reuniones limitadas a 10 o menos personas. Las cubiertas faciales y el distanciamiento social son la norma.

Fase 4: revitalización: la tasa de infección entre los examinados y el número de pacientes ingresados en el hospital continúa disminuyendo. Se permiten todas las reuniones de hasta 50 personas, reabrir restaurantes y bares, currículums de viajes, cuidado de niños y escuelas reabrir bajo la guía del IDPH. Las cubiertas faciales y el distanciamiento social son la norma.

Fase 5: Illinois restaurado: con una vacuna o un tratamiento altamente efectivo ampliamente disponible o la eliminación de cualquier caso nuevo durante un período prolongado, la economía se reabre por completo con la continuación de las precauciones de seguridad. Se permiten convenciones, festivales y grandes eventos, y todas las empresas, escuelas y lugares de recreación pueden abrirse con nuevas pautas y procedimientos de seguridad que reflejen las lecciones aprendidas durante la pandemia de COVID-19.

Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) is issuing a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to provide design services as lead Engineering Design firm for UP's part of CREATE Project EW2, from 80th street to CP Oakdale. This project is part of the 75th Street Corridor Improvement Program in Chicago, IL. The Engineering firm will work as an extension of UP staff to provide, civil, track, bridge design, subsurface utility exploration (SUE), and collaboration amongst multiple stakeholders in development of all EW2 design work. The scope of work includes, but is not limited to, the following activities in two primary functions:

Program Management

- Project Planning, Scheduling and Coordination.
- Stakeholder Coordination and Communications.
- Quality Assurance / Quality Control.
- Program Document Control and ensuring process compliance.

Civil, Track and Bridge Design

- Development of Final Track alignments from conceptual UP design
- Development of Final Bridge Plans
- SUE investigation
- Assembly of PS&E packages
- Development and assembly of bid documents for Civil, Track and Bridge.

Qualification documents will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Team
- Approach
- Experience
- Schedule/Hours
- Diversity/DBE

A separate stand alone RFQ will also be available for CREATE project WA1 professional right of way (ROW) services. This shall consist of but not limited to: appraisal reports, appraisal reviews, certification reports, negotiation, relocation and property management services, title, title review, survey and title insurance. The right-of-way services will occur in Cook County and require coordination with IDOT District 1 (approval of appraisers) as well as complying with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Policies Act of 1970. This RFQ will also be qualification based.

Qualification documents will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Team
- Approach
- Experience
- Schedule/Hours
- Diversity/DBE

The EW2 proposal is due on Friday June 19th, 2020, at 2:00pm CT Selection is expected to be finalized in July 2020.

The WA1 proposal is due on Friday May 29th, 2020, at 2:00pm CT Selection is expected to be finalized in June 2020.

The CREATE projects are funded in part by federal and/or state funds, interested firms will be required to comply with certain State and Federal policies, such as Equal Employment Opportunity, Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation, and the Davis-Bacon Act.

UPRR requires that a project manager be committed for the duration of both projects. UP-approved Roadway Worker Protection training and background investigations through e-VERIFILE.com are required. The EW2 Lead Engineer requires 25% DBE participation and the WA1 ROW Consultant requires 15% DBE participation. DBE firms must be currently listed on the Illinois Unified Certification Program (UCP) directory.

A mandatory preproposal webinar/conference call is scheduled for Friday May 15th, 2020 at 10:00 AM CT. Detail webinar information will be provided to those registered using the process described below. To encourage networking and facilitate opportunities for DBE participation, contact information for all participants who join the webinar/conference call will be made available temporarily online via the CREATE program website, after the webinar/conference call.

In the comment section towards the bottom of the Union Pacific Supplier Registration Request form, indicate if you want access to EW2, WA1, or both. needs, including food, clothing and housing costs; a medical card; therapeutic, educational, recreational and crisis support services; and access to caseworkers, training programs and support groups to meet the child's and family's needs.
