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Violence Prevention Organizations Commit to New Goals

Representatives of Communities Partnering 4 Peace, which includes organizations CP4P, READI Chicago, and Chicago CRED), held a Zoom press conference on Tuesday afternoon to tackle the increase in gun violence that took place this year, a toll that has taken the lives of nearly 800 people across the City. Vaughn Bryant, Executive Director CP4P & Metropolitan Peace Initiatives, "It's a reflection of our deeply troubled times—from COVID to economics. Gun violence is a public health crisis, and it won't be solved until we treat it like a public health crisis," Bryant said. His organization has research from the Northwestern Neighborhood & Network Initiative (N3) at Northwestern University showing a positive impact on communities they serve. Eddie Bocanegra, senior director of READI Chicago said during the Zoom press conference, "We cannot downplay the cost in lives and on communities, the unaddressed trauma, and our collective struggle to contain gun violence. At the same time, we know that our work is making a difference." He also highlighted research from the University of Chicago Crime Lab showing that the men involved in READI Chicago are much less likely to commit violent crimes or be victims of violent crime.

Last January, after three years of 13-15 percent annual declines in gun violence, CRED Founder Arne Duncan and community leaders set a goal of reducing gun violence by at least 20 percent per year for five years, which would put Chicago more on par with New York and Los Angeles. In fact, gun violence is up more than 50 percent in 2020 for both homicides and non-fatal shootings. Nevertheless, Duncan said the goal remains the same. "Chicago's murder rate should be on par with other big cities. Right now, we're not even close.

We have to think and act very differently," Duncan said. He recently called for more narrowly defining police responsibilities. shrinking the department and shifting hundreds of millions of dollars from policing into a variety community-based of approaches to public safety. Next year, the total public investment from local and state sources in violence programs prevention like CRED, READI and CP4P is approaching \$60 million dollars. Private funding will boost the overall investment to approximately \$90 million.

IDES Preparing to Administer New Federal COVID-19 Relief Legislation

The Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES) announced that it remains committed to implementing newly announced federal unemployment benefits and relief measures as quickly and effectively as possible. Over the weekend. President Trump signed the omnibus spending bill, H.R. 133, on Sunday, December 27. IDES and state unemployment agencies nationwide await further U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) guidance to begin supporting claimants and are urging federal authorities to not create further hardship as a result of the president's inaction.

Claimants are encouraged



to check the IDES website and social media platforms for additional updates. The Department will share additional information as soon as it becomes available. Included in the bill were critical extensions to the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA), Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC), and Extended Benefits (EB) programs, which technically expired on December 26 because of the delay in the presidential signature. Because of this delay, IDES and all other state unemployment agencies await guidance on how to move forward with continuing to accept and pay benefits under these programs.

Ford Calls for Greater Pharmacy Access

State Rep. La Shawn K. Ford, D-Chicago, is calling Governor JB Pritzker and the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) to ensure greater access to pharmacy services for Illinois Medicaid recipients who have Aetna as their managed care organization. As of December 1, 2020, Aetna Better Health Illinois Medicaid recipients must use CVS pharmacies or a limited number of smaller independent pharmacies. Using Walgreens is no longer an option for these recipients. Much of the West and South Sides of Chicago are pharmacy deserts, and CVS has closed many of their stores in these communities. There are no CVS pharmacies in the West Side communities



of Humboldt Park, East Garfield Park, West Garfield Park, North Lawndale, or Austin. "Limiting pharmacy options for Medicaid recipients affects not only people on the West and South Sides of Chicago, but people throughout Illinois," said Ford. "During a pandemic when people need their medications and even the

coronavirus vaccine when it is distributed through pharmacies, and when people are dying daily due to opioid overdoses, it makes no sense to limit access to pharmacies," said Rep. Ford. CVS Pharmacy bought the Aetna insurance company in 2018. Aetna bought IlliniCare in 2020, assuming its Illinois Medicaid patients.

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Illinois Department of Labor Issues Minimum Wage Hike Reminder



Illinois' minimum wage is set to increase to \$11 an hour on Friday, January 1, 2021. The Illinois Department of Labor is encouraging employees

to watch their paychecks to ensure that time worked in 2021 is paid at the new rate. Governor JB Pritzker signed legislation into law in 2019 providing a

path to a \$15 minimum wage by 2025. Minimum wage earners received two increases in 2020 to \$9.25 an hour on January 1 followed by an increase to \$10 an hour on July 1. The minimum wage will continue to increase an additional \$1 an hour each January 1 until it reaches \$15 an hour in 2025.

Workers who are under 18 years old and work fewer than 650 hours in a year will earn a minimum wage of \$8.50 per hour beginning January 1. The youth minimum wage rate will gradually rise to \$13 an hour by 2025. All Illinois employers are required to post the "Your Rights Under Illinois Employment Laws" in

a conspicuous location on the premises of the employer where notices to employees are customarily posted. Employees with problems regarding the minimum wage can file a complaint with IDOL at the following link: https:// www2.illinois.gov/idol/ Pages/Complaints.aspx or call 312-793-2800.



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Stimulus Checks for Americans On the Way



Americans in mixedstatus families will receive payments of \$600 per adult and \$600 per child in households with an undocumented spouse as part of a bill approved by Congress last week. On Sunday evening, President Trump signed the bill averting a government shutdown. The payments will cover about 3.5 million people who were previously denied \$1,200 stimulus checks per U.S. citizen adult and \$500 per citizen child. The new bill allows them to recover that money when they file their 2020 taxes in the Spring. Passed with overwhelming bipartisan support in both the House and the Senate, the bill also includes direct relief for small businesses, replenishes the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP)

and a streamlined loan forgiveness. It does not include stimulus checks for some three million American children who had the misfortune to be born to non-citizen parents who filed taxes using ITIN numbers. This exclusion denies them crucial survival funds and deprives the economy of \$1 billion in sorely-needed economic activity.
