# Saint Anthony Hospital Rolls Out Vaccine Education Program to West, Southwest Chicago

Saint Anthony Hospital started vaccinating eligible patients and community members in Tier 1B with a goal of vaccinating at least 1000 patients per week, but serving predominantly Latino and African American communities comes with more challenges in recruiting people due to more trust issues or access, so they wanted to take a more strategic in-person

approach.

Saint Anthony Hospital believes that direct community advocacy and education is key to a successful vaccination program, impacting communities who have been dramatically affected by COVID-19. It is an opportunity to help overcome some of the fear, as well as clear up a lot of misinformation circulating through social media and word of mouth. The majority of communication and access to appointments is happening online, which is not always as accessible for many individuals, especially seniors or essential workers that do not have the time.

We felt that one-on-one, in-person conversations may be more effective and helpful to people still hesitant or simply less informed about the vaccine and their access to getting it. Up to 100 community members will be recruited

for this program and will be engaging with people at public locations including grocery stores and churches, as well as partnering with local organizations to reach their respective clients.

"Saint Anthony is focused on having contact in person to create trust and ensuring that it is the least privileged and neediest people who receive the vaccine and keep them safe. More than ever personal contact is important and necessary. For my community it also shows interest and respect," Jacqeline Ortiz, Health Educator and resident of Little Village. In addition to educating residents about the vaccine,

the outreach team will also be able to schedule appointments for a vaccine at Saint Anthony Hospital right there and then to make it as convenient as possible. "We hope that Saint Anthony Hospital's longstanding relationship with the community might help overcome some of the clinical trust barriers," said Guy A. Medaglia, President and CEO of Saint Anthony Hospital, "and allow us the opportunity to provide information and answer questions so members of the community feel informed, safe and confident in taking this proactive step for their

# YMCA of Metro Chicago Offers Education and Child Care

The YMCA of Metropolitan Chicago will offer full-day education and child care to families needing assistance in the event in-person instruction and remote learning are not available to Chicago students. The YMCA's six-city locations are ready to help parents keep their kids learning, engaged and, most importantly safe. The program is typically provided throughout the year on days when school

is not in session but when parents still need to work. such as on state and federal holidays. School Days Out is open to children 5 - 12 years of age from 7 am to 6 pm, Monday through Friday on a first-come, first-serve basis. Students will need to pack their own breakfast, lunch, and snacks as meal services will not be provided due to health and safety concerns during the pandemic. Rates vary depending on location and start at \$40 a

day for members. Parents are encouraged to call their closest Y center for rates and to register. Financial assistance is available in some situations and families are advised to ask for more details at the time of registration.

# City Creates a Process for Police Misconduct Allegations



Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot signed an Executive Order creating the first City guidelines governing the release of materials directly to subjects of alleged police misconduct. Effective March 7, 2021, the Order creates a standardized, accessible and easy-to-navigate process for complainants to receive access to materials related to alleged police misconduct, including

video recordings. Under the new protocol, the firstof-its-kind in Chicago, victims of alleged police misconduct will receive swift access to materials without having navigate the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) process or be constrained by the limitations of FOIA. Under the new Order, complainants that have filed a complaint with COPA alleging police

misconduct in which they were the subject of the incident will be given the opportunity to submit a request to COPA for materials related to the incident. COPA will then notify the Chicago Police Department (CPD) and the Department of Law of the request within three days of receiving the request. Provided that the incident is not covered by the City's Video Release Policy, the City will release the following materials to the complainant as soon as practical, but no later than 30 calendar days following the request:

- •Video and audio recordings from CPD dash cameras and/or body-warncameras; and
- •Initial police reports, including original case reports and tactical response reports.



En vista del contínuo aumento de suplementos de la vacuna federal, Illinois está haciendo planes para expandir la elegibilidad de la Fase 1B el 25 de febrero, a personas que tienen comorbilidades y afecciones subyacentes según lo define CDC.

Además, Illinois hará una prioridad a personas con discapacidades. La administación Pritzker comenzará a trabajar con los departamentos de salud locales y otros proveedores del estado para incluir estas personas de alto riesgo en los planes de vacunación comunitaria

en las semanas que siguen. Los departamentos de salud que han completado substancialmente su población existente de la Fase 1B antes del 25 de febrero, la fecha de expansión a nivel estatal podrá adelantarse con la determinación de los funcionarios de salud
