labor safety committees be set up, and plans developed and implemented by these committees to address this

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Illinois Updates Mask Guidelines to Align with Federal Court Ruling

To coincide with the ending of the enforcement of the federal mask mandate on public transportation following a federal court ruling, Governor JB Pritzker announced he will revise Illinois’ executive order executive order lifting those requirements for the State of Illinois. “I’m proud of the work our state has done to fight COVID-19 and protect our most vulnerable,” said Governor JB Pritzker. “I continue to urge Illinoisans to follow CDC guidelines and, most importantly, get vaccinated to protect yourself and others.” As a result, masks will no longer be required on public transit, in public transit hubs, or in airports. Executive Order 2022-06 will be amended to reflect these changes. Local municipalities retain the right to establish their own mitigations, including masking requirements on public

transportation. “IDPH is closely monitoring the status of COVID-19 throughout Illinois and working with our local public health partners to keep the public informed,” said Acting IDPH Director Amaal Tokars. “The best way to protect yourself and your loved ones is to remain up-to-date on your vaccinations, and that includes booster shots, especially for those who are at risk for more severe health outcomes.” Nearly 73 percent of eligible Illinoisans are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and over 81 percent have had at least one dose of the vaccine. Vaccines are available regardless of immigration status or background, and can be found at vaccines.gov. The CDC continues to recommend that the immunocompromised, those who cannot be vaccinated, and those in congregate facilities wear masks to protect the vulnerable. The CDC



also recommends masks transmission. are worn in areas of high

and other safety concerns transit workers face,” said Congressman Jesús “Chuy” García in a statement to the media. “There has been a recent uptick in safety incidents on CTA’s subways and buses that has caused public concern. I look forward to working with CTA and the local Amalgamated Transit Unions to implement policies that address these safety concerns for both passengers and transit workers, while ensuring that we don’t over-police Latino and Black customers. Using the new tools and funding from the IIJA, we can ensure public transit is safe for everyone to ride.”

IIJA requires transit agencies to establish new safety committees, made up of an equal number of frontline employee representatives and management representatives, to identify safety issues and develop strategies to mitigate them; use a portion of their federal funds for safety-related

projects developed by the committees; and report all assaults on transit workers to the National Transit Database, which the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and transit agencies rely on in developing safety solutions.

Last month, Durbin met with leadership from the Amalgamated Transit Union (ATU), which represents thousands of CTA workers, to discuss new safety measures included in IIJA to better protect transit employees while on the job. In their letter, Congressman García and Senator Durbin emphasize that, “These new requirements, paired with the significant increase in transit funding the CTA will receive from the IIJA, should allow the CTA to implement policies that will protect its employees and customers while further investing in the capital projects necessary to improve the system, expand capacity, and rebuild ridership lost during the pandemic.”

El Congresista Jesús “Chuy” García (IL-04) Miembro del Comité de Transporte e Infraestructura de la Cámara de Representantes y cofundador del Future of Transportation Caucus, y líder de la mayoría en el Senado Dick Durbin (D-IL) envió una carta al Presidente de la Autoridad de Tránsito de Chicago Dorval Carter, a principios de esta semana, exhortándolo a implementar una provisión requerida por el Acta de Inversión de Infraestructura y Empleos (IIJA) y ayudará a mejorar la seguridad de los trabajadores de tránsito y los pasajeros.

IIJA contiene disposiciones innovadoras para mejorar la seguridad de los trabajadores al exigir que se establezcan comités de seguridad conjuntos entre la gerencia y el trabajo, y que estos comités desarrollen e implementen planes para abordar esta y otras preocupaciones de seguridad que enfrentan los trabajadores”, dijo el congresista Jesús “Chuy” García en una declaración a los medios de comunicación. “Ha habido un aumento reciente en los incidentes

de seguridad en los subterráneos y autobuses de la CTA que ha causado preocupación pública. Espero trabajar con la CTA y los Sindicatos de Tránsito Amalgamados locales para implementar políticas que aborden estas preocupaciones de seguridad, tanto para los pasajeros como para los trabajadores de tránsito, mientras nos aseguramos de no vigilar en exceso a los clientes latinos y negros. Usando las nuevas herramientas y los fondos del IIJA, podemos garantizar que el transporte público sea seguro para todos”.

IIJA requiere que las agencias de tránsito establezcan nuevos comités de seguridad compuestos por un número igual de

representantes de los empleados de primera línea y representantes de la gerencia, para identificar problemas de seguridad y desarrollar estrategias para mitigarlos; utilizar una parte de sus fondos federales para proyectos relacionados con la seguridad desarrollados por los comités; y reportar todas las agresiones a los trabajadores de tránsito a la Base de Datos Nacional de Tránsito, en la cual la Administración Federal de Tránsito (FTA) y las agencias de tránsito confían en el desarrollo de soluciones de seguridad.

Illinois Launches Health Care Coverage for Older Immigrant Adults



Building on the first-in-the-nation program Illinois launched in late 2020, the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services has launched the Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults program to provide health care coverage to undocumented immigrant adults and certain legal permanent residents aged 55 to 64. Covered services include

doctor and hospital visits, lab tests, physical and occupational therapy, mental health, substance abuse disorder services, dental and vision services, and prescription drugs. Individuals are eligible for coverage through this program if they meet these requirements:

- They are between the ages of 55-64.
- They are either an

undocumented immigrant or a legal permanent resident of the United States for less than five years.

- Annual household income is at or below \$18,754 for one person; \$25,268 for two people. The income limit is equal to the ACA Adult program.

Following the General Assembly’s passage of HB 4343 during the

spring legislative session, the Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults program will expand further to include eligible adults aged 42 to 54, effective July 1. Individuals can apply for new benefits at any time using the following methods:

- By contacting a community service agency for assistance applying in 59 languages
- By mail using the online paper application, or requesting a paper application through the ABE Customer Call Center.
