# **CPS Students Participate in Expanded 2022 Summer School Opportunities and Courses**



Nearly 91,000 Chicago Public School students are participating in summer academic and enrichment classes, internships, day camps and additional programming, up from the 55,000 students last year. Summer opportunities include academic classes to help students catch up or get ahead, as well as paid internships and jobs, and middle school Career and Technical Education (CTE) camps that offer an introductory overview of fields, from aviation to the culinary arts. Summer athletic opportunities and out-ofschool enrichment camps are among the additional opportunities that are rounding out this summer's offerings. Nearly 30,000

students are participating in locally-developed out-ofschool programs focused on sports and fitness, technology, STEM, the arts, and more. More than 1,000 CPS high school students are participating in paid internships with 135 corporate partners, city governmental departments and agencies, as well as non-profit organizations across the city. Students are earning \$15.40 an hour as they contribute their skills and gain on-the-job experience in the fields of law and public safety, education, transportation, media and communication arts, business and finance, manufacturing, information technology and more.

For many, like Iselle Martinez, a Class of 2022 graduate of Sarah E. Goode STEM Academy, the experience is life changing. She is completing a sixweek-long internship at IBM and hopes to continue to work part-time for the company as she attends the University of St. Louis where she plans to major in international business and minor in finance.

# **IDOC Encourages Applications to the Northwestern Prison Education Program (NPEP)**



The Northwestern Prison Education Program (NPEP) is now accepting applications for a new cohort of students for the 2022-2023 academic year. IDOC partners with NPEP, a degree-granting initiative of Northwestern University, and Oakton Community College to provide a high-quality liberal arts education to individuals in custody at Stateville Correctional Center. Northwestern is the only top-ten university in the country to confer its own bachelor's degrees to students in a prison education program. NPEP will expand to include the third cohort of students at Stateville Correctional Center with support from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. This academic year is the first time NPEP

will consider applications from eligible candidates in IDOC facilities across the state of Illinois. This new opportunity supports the Department's Incentive Based Corrections model, which provides programming opportunities to more individuals based on their individual case plan. To participate in the program, all accepted students will need to transfer to Stateville Correctional Center in Crest Hill, IL, which is now a multi-security facility. Each NPEP cohort is limited to 20 students. Prospective students have until August 15<sup>th</sup> to

# Youth Karate Instructor Charged with Dissemination and Possession of Child Pornography



A Des Plaines man who worked as a youth karate instructor has been charged with Dissemination and Possession of Child Pornography after investigators determined he viewed and distributed several sexually explicit images and videos of children under the age of 13

through social media, Cook County Sheriff Thomas J. Dart announced last week. Sheriff's Police Special Victims Unit investigators received a cyber tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children about underage pornographic images and videos found on a social

media account linked to Sachin Pillai, 22, of the 2300 block of Eastview Drive in Des Plaines. On Tuesday, July 26, SVU investigators executed a search warrant for his residence where they seized his cell phone and an electronic tablet, and he was taken into custody
