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
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# Alertas de Calidad del Aire Vigentes Para el Area de Chicago

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# Air Quality Alerts in Effect for Chicago Area

As the Chicagoland area continues to be under air quality alert due to the Canadian wildfires, the City of Chicago and the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) are advising residents to stay vigilant. As smoke from the wildfires in Canada continues to impact Chicago's air quality, recommendations have been set in place to help residents, especially those in sensitive populations, including those with heart and lung disease, older adults, pregnant women,

and young children. IEPA also advises families to take precautions when planning outdoor activities. The City released their guidelines to help residents plan their days as well as released indoor spaces for vulnerable populations to utilize public libraries, senior centers, Park District facilities, or the six community service centers that operate from 9am to 5pm:

- Englewood Center – 1140 W. 79th Street
- Garfield Center – 10 S. Kedzie Ave. (24 Hours)
- King Center – 4314 S. Cottage Grove

- North Area Center – 845 W. Wilson Ave.
- South Chicago Center – 8650 S. Commercial Ave.

Below are a few suggestions of how residents can protect themselves during the Air

Quality Alert:

- Avoid spending time outdoors. If you must go outside, keep outdoor activity short and wear a KN95 or N95 mask while outside.
- Stay indoors and keep

A continuación unas cuantas sugerencias de

- Evite pasar tiempo al aire libre. Si tiene que salir, mantenga sus actividades fuera corto tiempo y use una máscara KN95 o N95 cuando esté fuera.
- Permanezca en el interior y mantenga el aire interior tan puro como sea posible no fumando, utilizando velas o usando la aspiradora.
- Siga el consejo de su doctor si tiene asma o enfermedades

cardiovasculares o pulmonares. Algunos síntomas por respirar el humo incluyen jadeos, dolor en el pecho, falta de respiración y problemas al respirar. Si los síntomas empeoran, llame a su médico o al 911.

- Mantenga las ventanas y las puertas cerradas y prenda su aire acondicionado si tiene uno. Busque albergue en algún lado si no tiene aire acondicionado o si su casa está demasiado caliente.
- Utilice un filtro de aire si tiene uno.
- Limite el conducir un vehículo, si es posible.
- Manténgase sintonizado con las noticias locales y los consejos de los medios de comunicación.

## Commissioner Aguilar, Bureau of Economic Development, and IMEC Partners with Melrose Park's Chamber of Commerce for Manufacturing Reinvented Event

On Thursday, June 15th, Commissioner Frank J. Aguilar partnered with Melrose Park's Chamber of Commerce and Community Development, the Illinois Manufacturing Excellence Center, and Cook County's Bureau of Economic Development for a Manufacturing Reinvented seminar and workshop in Melrose Park.

The event, which attracted over 50 organizations, was held to inform 16th District manufacturers about available grants for their businesses and to offer onsite application assistance. These grants are funded through the Illinois Manufacturing Excellence Center, in partnership with Cook County's Bureau of Economic Development,

to boost operations for manufacturers and businesses over a wide range of subjects. Interested parties could apply for grants to help with website design, cybersecurity, employee retention and promotion, business marketing, and more. In total, \$5 million of grant funding is available to Cook

County manufacturers. The event began with a networking session, as representatives from the

attending organizations discussed their work, goals, and business needs. After the networking

session, a presentation was conducted by the Cook County Bureau of Economic Development and IMEC that gave an overview of the program and the needed qualifications to be eligible to apply.



your indoor air as clean as possible by not smoking, using candles, or vacuuming.

- Follow your doctor's advice if you have asthma, lung or cardiovascular disease. Some symptoms of breathing smoke include wheezing, chest pain, shortness of breath, and trouble breathing. If your symptoms worsen, call your physician or 911.

- Keep windows and doors closed and turn on your air conditioner if you have one. Seek shelter elsewhere if you do not have an air conditioner and your home is too warm.

- Use an air filter if you have one.

- Limit driving a vehicle if possible.

- Stay tuned to local news media advisories.

# Man Charged with Attempted Murder in Road Rage Shooting

A Chicago man has been charged with attempted murder after a Sheriff's Police investigation found he shot at two motorists during a road rage incident, Cook County Sheriff Thomas J. Dart announced ON June 24<sup>th</sup>. At approximately 11:55 p.m. on May 22, 2022, Sheriff's Police responded to the 8800 block of West Golf Road where they met a 19-year-old man and an 18-year-old woman, who had been shot in the leg. Sheriff's Police detectives learned that the driver of another vehicle pulled out a firearm and fired a shot at the victims' vehicle during a road rage incident that began in a

of Investigation agents located Contreras in Lewisburg, Tennessee on June 8 and took him into custody without incident. After waiving extradition, Contreras returned to Cook County on June 23. Later that day, the Cook County State's Attorney's Office approved two counts of attempted first degree murder, one count of aggravated battery with a firearm, and one count of aggravated unlawful use of a weapon against Contreras. Contreras appeared for a bond hearing today at the George N. Leighton Criminal Court Building, where a judge ordered him held on a \$500,000 D bond with electronic monitoring. The public



gas station parking lot in the 9200 block of Golf Road in unincorporated Maine Township. The offending vehicle had its lights off while pursuing the offenders and drove away after the shooting. During the course of their investigation, detectives identified the offender as 37-year-old Juan M. Contreras. An arrest warrant was issued for Contreras on May 30, 2022. On May 9, 2023, a federal arrest warrant for unlawful flight to avoid prosecution was approved by a federal judge. Federal Bureau

is reminded that the defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty by the government in a court of law.
