# **Attorney General Raoul Files Lawsuit Against** Meta for Business Practices that Harm Children



Illinois Attorney General Kwame Raoul announced that his office filed a lawsuit against Meta Platforms Inc. (Meta), the company that owns and operates Facebook and Instagram, for its harmful business practices targeting children. The lawsuit, backed by a broad, bipartisan coalition of 33

states, was filed on Tuesday in the federal district court for the Northern District of California. In their lawsuit, Raoul and the attorneys general allege that Meta's business model, which seeks to capture as much user time and attention as possible to sell advertising, has targeted youth, including

teenagers and younger children, in ways that take advantage of them. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), suicide is the second-leading cause of death among youth between the ages of 10 and 14. During the decade since Instagram's rise in popularity, the CDC

reported that the number of high school students who experience feelings of persistent sadness and hopelessness, and suicidal thoughts and ideation increased by 40 percent. In that same time period, there was a 30 percent increase in the rate of high school girls who attempted suicide.

Raoul and the coalition allege that Meta designed its social media platforms to include features that exploit young users' psychological vulnerabilities to keep them using the platforms longer, and that many of these product features are strongly linked to damaging psychological outcomes. According to the surgeon general, eighth and tenth graders now spend an average of three-and-ahalf hours per day on social media. In Illinois, nearly a million Illinois teenagers between the ages of 13 and 17 access Instagram every month. From 2020 to 2021 in Illinois alone, over half a million Illinois teenagers

between the ages of 13 and 17 accessed Instagram every day. Raoul's lawsuit alleges that Meta violated the federal Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA) by collecting the personal information of children under the age of 13 without obtaining parental permission as required by that statute. The coalition is asking the court to enter an injunction stopping Meta from continuing these unlawful practices. # Cook County Medical Debt Relief Initiative Abolishes over \$280 Million in Medical Debt for Cook County Residents

Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle announced Cook County's Medical Debt Relief Initiative (MDRI) has successfully acquired and abolished a total of \$281.3 million in medical debt

to benefit 158,541 Cook County residents since the program launched in 2022. The most recent round of debt abolishment was made possible by UChicago Medicine. Cook County worked with its program

administrator RIP Medical Debt, a national non-profit, to purchase medical debt from UChicago Medicine and forgive \$173.7 million for 85,060 patients who received care at the University of Chicago

Medical Center in Hyde Park, the University of Chicago Physicians Group or UChicago Medicine Ingalls Memorial Hospital in Harvey, IL. On average, each UChicago Medicine patient saw \$2,043 in

Notice is hereby given that Clyde Park District (the "Park District") will receive sealed bids for leak repairs and liner replacement at the Parkholme Pool (the "Pool") located at 1820 S. 51st. Street, Cicero, IL 60804.

The bidder must also be bonded and insured and present proof of the same. The bidder shall also submit a sworn notarized statement that they will comply with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, including but not limited to reporting as required by law. (820 ILCS 130/2, et seq.) The bidder shall also include the cost of obtaining all permits for the project.

A bidder may choose to bid on work associated with both the "Leak Repair" and "Liner Replacement" projects, or bidder may bid on each project individually. Descriptions of the requested projects are set forth below:

#### Leak Repair

- 1) Sawcut, demolish, and remove concrete at the pool's main drain line located in a tunnel;
- 2) Repair the main drainpipe and test the line to ensure proper flow and use; and
- 3) Prepare areas for new concrete, including, but not limited to:
  - Ensuring the ground is level and properly graded to facilitate proper drainage away from the pool;
  - Excavating the area;
  - Compact the soil to create a stable and even base; iii
  - Constructing formwork:
  - Laying compacting a subbase layer of gravel or crushed stone;
  - Installing expansion joints or isolation joints along the edges of the concrete area; vi.
  - Coating existing reinforcement and adding reinforcement, if necessary;
  - viii. Ensuring proper curing to keep concrete moist and prevent cracks; and
  - Applying sealing, if determined necessary.
- 4) Clean up the site and dispose of any waste materials.

#### **Liner Replacement**

Remove and replace the pool liner for the entire pool. Steps include, but are not limited to:

- Completely draining the pool to expose the existing liner;
- Removing the old pool liner, making sure to detach it from any coping or track systems that
- Inspecting the pool's structure for any damage or repairs;
- Patching and repairing any cracks, holes, or imperfections in the pool's surface and ensure pool is free of debris;
- Ordering and providing a new liner;
- Installing the new liner into the pool and smoothing out any wrinkles and ensure a snug fit; and
- Cleaning up the site and disposing of any waste materials.

debt relief, with over 75 percent of patient reporting households annual incomes below \$51,000. The program is funded by \$12 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) dollars. To administer MDRI, Cook County partners with RIP Medical Debt, a national, independent 501(c)(3)charitable organization. Through the partnership, RIP Medical Debt contacts hospitals and health systems serving Cook County and negotiates the sale or donation of portfolios of medical debt. Individuals who qualify for medical debt abolishment through MDRI must live

in Cook County, have incomes up to 400 percent of the current Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG), or have medical debt that is 5 percent or more of their annual income. Medical debt abolishment cannot be requested by an individual. Eligible patients will have debt erased without taking any action. Recipients are notified by mail that their debts have been relieved, and any negative marks on their credit reports associated with this debt are removed. # **Pritzker Administration Announces Small Business Grant Awards for B2B Restaurants, Hotels and Arts**

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) today announced the conclusion of the Back to Business (B2B) Restaurants, Hotels and Arts program with \$156 million provided in relief funds. Through these three programs, nearly 4,000 grants went to businesses in over 500 cities, towns and localities in 95 counties across the state. A list of Illinois B2B grantees can be found at www.dceo. illinois.gov B2B Arts and B2B Restaurants grant award amounts were determined based on a percentage of revenue declines, and funding for the B2B Hotels awards was allocated based on the number of rooms. Grants had an average award amount of \$39,484, with



different ranges of funding available depending on the business type. The grant program utilized American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding and was designed to offset losses and support job retention in the industries hardest-hit by the COVID-19 pandemic. Through the pandemic, the Pritzker administration has provided assistance to totaling more than \$1.5 billion through DCEO programs. Through B2B and BIG programs alone, Illinois has distributed 19,500 awards businesses totaling nearly \$700 million.

# Time is Running Out to Apply for FEMA Assistance



The deadline to apply for federal assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency is October 30 if you suffered losses from the flooding and storms that struck the state June 29 – July 2. Registering with FEMA is as easy as a phone call to the FEMA Hotline, 800-621-3362, or a visit to a nearby Disaster Recovery Center, which you can find at FEMA Disaster Recovery Locator. Users of a video

relay service, captioned telephone service, or other communication services need to provide FEMA the specific number assigned for that service. Survivors can also register through DisasterAssistance.gov, or on the FEMA app on their phones. If you have already registered, you can keep in touch with FEMA via the Helpline, 800-621-3362, to change your contact information, get your questions answered

or to track the progress of your application. Whether you are a homeowner, renter or business owner, you may be eligible for a FEMA grant and/or an SBA disaster loan that may help get you on the way to recovering from disaster losses. 
