City of Chicago Announces New Shelter Stay Policy

With the aim of accelerating resettlement efforts for new arrivals, the City of Chicago is announcing the next phase of the New Arrivals Mission. Three new efforts build upon the work that the City has been doing for the past year. First, in partnership with the State of Illinois, the City is increasing personnel at the landing zone to help new arrivals reunite with their friends, family or verified sponsors. The City is regulating “rogue buses” which cause unnecessary logistical obstacles for intake and put the lives of new arrivals in danger – particularly as

the temperatures drop. New regulatory tools will allow the City to cite and fine bus companies that disregard curfews, landing zone locations and loading/unloading protocols. Finally, the City will implement a limited stay policy along with additional supports from the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS). For individuals and families currently in City shelters, the City will be issuing 60-day exit notices in waves based on their arrival date to shelter. •New arrivals who entered shelter in 2022 will receive a 60-day notice beginning 11/17/2023. Approximately

50 people will receive notices in this group. •New arrivals who entered shelter between 1/1/2023 - 7/31/2023 will begin receiving 60-day notices on 12/4/2023. Approximately 3,000 people currently in shelter arrived in this timeframe. •New arrivals who entered shelter between 7/31/2023 - 11/16/2023 will begin receiving 60-day notices on 2/1/2024. Approximately 8,800 people currently in shelter arrived in this timeframe. •All new arrivals to shelter on or after 11/17/2023 will receive a 60-day notice upon intake.



La Ciudad de Chicago Anuncia Nueva Política de Estadía en Refugios



Con el objetivo de acelerar los esfuerzos de reasentamiento para los recién llegados, la ciudad de Chicago está anunciando la siguiente fase de la Misión para Recién Llegados. Tres nuevos esfuerzos siguen al trabajo que la Ciudad ha estado haciendo desde el año pasado. Primero, en colaboración con el Estado de Illinois, la Ciudad está aumentando personal en la zona de aterrizaje para ayudar a los recién llegados a reunirse con sus amigos, familiares o patrocinadores verificados. La ciudad regula los “autobuses corruptos”, que obstaculizan innecesariamente la logística de entrada y ponen en peligro la vida de los recién llegados, sobre todo cuando bajan

las temperaturas. Nuevos medios regulatorios permitirán a la Ciudad citar y multar compañías de autobuses que no hacen caso del toque de queda, lugar de zonas de desembarco, y protocolos de carga/descarga. Finalmente, la Ciudad implementará una política de estancia limitada junto con apoyo adicional del Departamento de Servicios Humanos de Illinois (IDHS). Para personas y familias que actualmente se encuentran en albergues de la Ciudad, la Ciudad expedirá avisos de salida en 60 días basada en la fecha de llegada al albergue. •Los recién llegado que entraron al albergue en el 2022 recibirán un aviso de 60 días a partir del 11/17/2023.

Aproximadamente 50 personas recibirán el aviso en este grupo. •Los recién llegados que entraron al albergue entre el 1/1/202 - 7/31/2023 comenzarán a recibir avisos de 60 días el 12/4/23. Aproximadamente 3,000 personas actualmente en el albergue llegaron alrededor de esta fecha. •Los recién llegados que entraron al albergue entre el 7/31/2023 - 11/16/2023 comenzarán a recibir avisos de 60 días el 2/1/2024. Aproximadamente 8,800 personas actualmente en el albergue llegaron durante este tiempo. •Todos los recién llegados al refugio a partir del 17/11/2023 recibirán un aviso de 60 días después de la admisión.

McDonald's Relaunches Grant Program to Benefit Chicago-Based Youth Organizations

Spotlighting Our Hero

Experiencing a life filled with adversities from an early age would leave anyone collapsing into a state of perpetual negativity, but not for Union League Boys and Girls Clubs Senior Vice President Hector Perez who overcame the obstacles with unwavering determination. Born in the projects of Puerto Rico, Perez, one of 13 siblings, moved to Chicago with his family after his father, who suffered from alcoholism, passed away. “We moved for the opportunity to have a better life, that’s what we believed we would have here, a fresh

start,” said Perez. “Unbeknownst to me, we would be facing another challenge. I learned that there were gangs in Humboldt Park, there were boundaries and there were limits. I left the projects thinking our lives would be better, but it was difficult. I lived in a two-bedroom apartment with 13 of my siblings, we didn’t understand the language, we were worried to leave our house because of the gangs, it was a new world, and we were terrified.” While Perez’s mother worked tirelessly to provide for her family as a single mother, Perez struggled not to succumb to the pull of the gangs promising



a sense of brotherhood and the lack of a father figure was apparent leaving him to search for the meaning of family. As luck would have it, Perez’s life would change when he entered the doors of the Union League Boys and Girls Club in search of water. “I heard about the Club once before, but never walked in. It just so happened that it was a particularly hot day, and I was searching for a water fountain. Once I

walked through those doors my life changed. I saw kids playing soccer, I saw the staff taking care of the kids, I noticed there were male mentors and me not having a father, it was important to have a male mentor. I quickly realized that this is what a family is, and I instantly became a Club kid,” said Perez.

In 1981, Perez joined the Union League Boys and Girls Clubs and hit the ground running becoming the youngest junior staff member at 14 years old to then becoming the youngest program director, and at the age of 17 was given a full-time position. Continuing to rise through the ranks, Perez is now senior vice president overseeing 21 locations across Chicago, which includes sites in Englewood, Humboldt Park, Pilsen, and South Lawndale as well as oversee the Club’s collaboration with the Cook County Juvenile Detention Center and the 247-acre residential summer camp

in Wisconsin. The Union League of Boys and Girls Clubs provides after-school

programs, such as homework help and tutoring, STEM instruction and robotics, sports and physical activity, and mentorship. Perez’s arduous work and contributions garnered him recognition in 2015 when he received the Director’s Community Leadership Award from then FBI Director James B. Comey. Each day, more than 2,000 youth walk through the Clubs and Perez’s mission is to foster family ties and build a stronger community. “We have the greatest kids in our communities, they are amazing, smart, caring, responsible,” said Perez. “We are here to provide our parents, our youth with the tools to succeed, to have better choices in life.
