Governor Pritzker Announces Funding for 46 New All-Electric School Buses



Governor JB Pritzker joined the Illinois

Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) to

announced seven grant awards totaling more than \$13 million for 46 new all-electric school

buses. The funding will allow school districts and student transportation companies to retire older diesel-powered buses and provide the necessary charging infrastructure for the new electric buses, helping improve air quality to students and the surrounding communities. The grants are funded by Illinois' allocation of the multibillion-dollar Volkswagen (VW) Settlement and will be distributed by Illinois EPA's Driving a Cleaner Illinois Program. The grant program was developed to distribute funding for various types of mobile electrification source

projects. Illinois EPA has spent nearly \$108 million in VW Settlement funds to date, funding 122 electric school buses and 65 direct current fast charging sites in the Chicago and the Metro-East, and seven other VW priority counties. Driving a Cleaner Illinois Program recipients were selected through a competitive Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) process that was opened to school districts or commercial school bus providers located in the three priority areas outlined in Illinois' BMP for the VW Settlement. Grants ranged from \$200,000 to \$17,700,000.

Reps Ramirez, Lee, Frost Introduce Legislation to Ensure Congress' Constitutional Duty to Conduct Oversight of the Executive Branch



Congresswoman Delia Ramirez (IL-03), member of the Homeland Security Committee, joined Representatives Summer L. Lee (PA-12) and Maxwell Frost (FL-10) to introduce the Congressional Oversight Access Act. The timely legislation would protect Members of Congress from violence, obstruction, and retaliation when conducting oversight of the executive branch. On June 18, Congresswoman

Ramirez and members of the Illinois delegation, Danny K. Davis (IL-07), Jesús "Chuy" García (IL-04), and Jonathan Jackson (IL-01), were unlawfully denied entry to a U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Processing Center in Broadview, Illinois. The Congressional Oversight Access Act makes it illegal for executive branch officials to use force or obstruct a Member of Congress acting in their

official oversight capacity. The bill explicitly defines protected oversight activities to include reviewing, monitoring, supervising, investigating, or visiting federal programs, facilities, or agencies to ensure compliance with laws, court orders, and the proper administration of federal policies. Overview of the Congressional Oversight Access Act:

- Protects Members of Congress from the use of force, arrest, or retaliation while conducting oversight in their official capacity.
- Defines covered oversight activities to include investigations, monitoring, visitation, and supervision of federal entities and operations.
- Responds to recent incidents where Members were arrested or obstructed during lawful oversight.

El Gobernador Pritzker Anuncia Financiación para 46 Nuevos Autobuses Escolares Totalmente Eléctricos



El Gobernador J. B. Pritzker se unió a la Agencia de Protección Ambiental de Illinois (EPA de Illinois) para anunciar siete subvenciones por un total de más de 13 millones de dólares para 46 nuevos autobuses escolares totalmente eléctricos. La financiación permitirá a los distritos escolares y a las empresas de transporte estudiantil retirar los autobuses diésel más antiguos y proporcionar la infraestructura de carga necesaria para los nuevos

autobuses eléctricos, lo que contribuirá a mejorar la calidad del aire para los estudiantes y las comunidades circundantes. Las subvenciones se financian con la asignación de Illinois del Acuerdo multimillonario Volkswagen (VW) y serán distribuidas por el Programa "Conduciendo un Illinois más Limpio" de la EPA de Illinois. Éste programa de subvenciones se creó para distribuir fondos para diversos tipos de proyectos de electrificación de fuentes móviles.

La EPA de Illinois ha invertido casi 108 millones de dólares en fondos del Acuerdo VW hasta la fecha, financiando 122 autobuses escolares eléctricos y 65 puntos de carga rápida de corriente continua en Chicago y el área metropolitana del este, así como en otros siete condados prioritarios de VW. Los beneficiarios del Programa Impulsando un Illinois Más Limpio se seleccionaron mediante un proceso competitivo de Notificación de Oportunidad de Financiamiento (NOFO), abierto a distritos escolares o proveedores comerciales de autobuses escolares ubicados en las tres áreas prioritarias descritas en el Plan de Gestión de Illinois (BMP) para el Acuerdo VW. Las subvenciones oscilaron entre \$200,000 y \$17,700,000.

Chicago Public Schools Announces Lay Offs

Earlier this week, Chicago Public Schools (CPS) announced it is set to lay off more than 1,400 works to adjust for enrollment and programming changes. The total includes 432 teachers, about 1.8 percent of the total teaching force, and 311 paraprofessionals and school-related personnel. CPS said such layoffs

are part of traditional school-level changes it makes nearly every year. Last year, the district laid off 1,410 workers, but about 80 percent of them were able to find new positions at CPS before the start of the next school year. "While the budgets provided to schools in May and approved by Local School Councils in June maintain overall levels of funding, CPS is still

working to close a \$734 million budget deficit before bringing a balanced Fiscal Year 2026 budget to the Board for approval in August. Despite this financial challenge, the goal of the District remains protecting the current funding provided in the posted school budget," a statement from CPS. Two weeks ago, 161 employees were fired, including 87 crossing guards. Back in May, CPS also laid off 530 tutors originally hired with pandemic relief funds, a program the district said did not yield the results it hoped for. Over the next two weeks, CPS will host a series of community engagement events to garner public input on strategies to close the budget deficit. Everything you need to know about your Property Index Number or PIN

If you own property in Cook County, there's one number you should always know: your PIN. That's short for Property Index Number—a 14-digit code assigned to every piece of real estate in the county. It's tied to the legal description of your property and is used for assessments, tax rates, exemptions and collections. Whether you own a house, a vacant lot, a parking space or a condominium, your property has a PIN. Think of it as the Social Security number for your home. And just like with your

Social Security number, using the wrong one can cause major problems.

If you don't pay on the right PIN—you haven't paid your taxes. You've just paid someone else's. That means your property be would marked delinquent, and you might not even know it until it's too late. You can find your PIN on any property tax bill. If you recently bought your home or purchased it years ago, it should be on your deed. If it's not on the deed, go to cookcountytreasurer. com, click the purple box and enter your address. You'll see a photo of your property and your correct

Still think you don't need to know your PIN? If your mortgage company pays your taxes through an escrow account, you might assume everything is being handled. But you should still double-check. Knowing your PIN allows you to verify that taxes are being paid in full, on time, and—most importantly on the correct property. In another scenario you might be sharing a PIN with other owners. That happens with newly built homes, condos or townhouses that haven't vet been subdivided. If someone else with whom you share a PIN fails to

pay their share, the whole PIN can go delinquent and your property can be at risk even if you paid your entire portion.

If that's the case, contact Cook County Assessor's Legal Department to find out how to make payments by legal description. Doing so ensures you're only paying what you owe and not footing the bill for a neighbor who has yet to pay. You'll also need your PIN if you want to:

•Request a duplicate tax bill

·Check for refunds or your exemption status

•Ask questions about your bill or payment history

And yes, PINs can change. When a property is split, combined or redeveloped, new PINs are assigned. That's common with new construction, subdivisions and even converted parking spaces. If you just bought a new home or condo, it's especially important to make sure you're paying taxes on the correct—and current— PIN. Bottom line: the PIN is the key to your property's tax identity. Know it. Use it. And check it online because mistakes can happen, and the longer they're left to fester, the more expensive they become.



End of Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults


